#### ORTHOPTERA RECORDING SCHEME

#### Newsletter No. 6 - Spring 1980

The summer of 1979 did not maintain the standard of fine weather set by nearly all the preceding "nine" summers of this century. Indeed in the North it was one of the worst on record. Nevertheless, for Orthoptera recorders the season proved to be one of the most fruitful in the post-1960 period. In consequence this newsletter has been prepared primarily to enable recorders to update the revised provisional Atlas, issued in December 1979, containing records received to the end of June of that year.

#### Some noteworthy recent records

- Map 2 Meconema thalassinum (De G.). Recent (1975) confirmation of its occurrence in two widely separated localities in Western Ireland by Dr M C D Speight, is particularly welcome. These records were included in the revised Atlas at the last minute, but the remainder mentioned below will all need to be added. Most are in fact post-July '79 records.
- Map 4 <u>Decticus verrucivorus</u> (L.). An exciting and quite unexpected discovery was that of a specimen of the wartbiter (now in the B.M.) from wasteland on chalk in an industrial area in Bedfordshire; August '79, D G Rands.
- Map 8 Metrioptera roeselii (Hagen). K Payne confirmed that the species was still flourishing in Aug. '75 in its long-known inland locality in Lincolnshire, while three new sites have been located this summer: Benacre, Suffolk, Sept. '79, G W Maybury; Sandwich Bay, Kent, Sept. '79, A Henderson; and at Riddlesdown, Surrey, Aug.'79, R D Hawkins.
- Map 10 Conocephalus dorsalis (Latr.) has now been located in North Devon Torridge estuary at Bideford, July '79, R Cumming.
- Map 11 Leptophyes punctatissima (Bosc) a second recent Irish record: in the conservatory of a private house at Howth, Dublin, Oct. '76, P T Harding.
- Map 15 Gryllotalpa gryllotalpa (L.) Norton Green, nr Yarmouth I.O.W., a singleton under a garden shed, Oct. '76, D Cooper (reported in the latest publication of the I.O.W. N.H.S. Transactions)
- Map 20 Stenobothrus lineatus (Panz.) A first record for East Suffolk (specimen in B.M.), Westleton Heath, Aug. '79, G W Maybury.
- Map 22 Omocestus rufipes (Zett.) Interesting discovery of a small colony in a regularly surveyed area well away from any other known locality; Studland, Aug. '79, J R Cox.
- Map 25 Gomphocerippus rufus (L.) Confirmation of the continued existence of the long-known isolated colony at Folkestone Warren, Sept. 179, R Cumming.
- Map 26 Chorthippus albomarginatus (De G.) Very welcome discovery of a colony in N. Wales, Chwilog, Lleyn Peninsula, 1976, A Vaughan Jones.

#### Earwigs and Cockroaches

The Orthoptera Survey is now extended to cover native earwigs and cockroaches (Ectobius spp.) On the advice of several experienced entomologists it does not seem feasible, however, to extend the survey to include bristle-tails (Thysanura). Records of native earwigs and cockroaches from Britain and Ireland are most welcome. Ireland appears to be particularly badly recorded for earwigs.

A Key to British Earwigs was given by A Brindle, Entomologist's Gazette Vol. 28 (1977), pp. 29-37. D R Ragge (1965) Grasshoppers, Crickets & Cockroaches of the British Isles, Warne, included keys and descriptions of the Ectobius species.
